
People in Britain give presents to their family and friends, and sometimes to their work colleagues and boss.

In the UK, people often give presents to their friends and family on Christmas Day (25th December). They also send Christmas cards to their friends and family. The cards usually have a picture of something related to Christmas, for example, a **reindeer** or a **snowman**. Some people make their own presents for their family. For example, they might bake cookies or make a photo album. People often give their close friends a small present perhaps some chocolates, a **bath bomb set** or a book.

It's not necessary to buy presents for your work colleagues and boss, but people often do it. It's not always easy to know what to buy for your work colleagues, because you might not know them very well. Some people buy small presents for everyone they work with, for example, chocolates or a small bottle of wine. Others only buy presents for their closest work friends. People don't usually spend a lot of money on these presents - £5-£15 is normal.

If you want to buy a present for your boss, you need to be careful. You should choose something that isn't too expensive, but that is also nice. Some people buy a box of chocolates or a bottle of wine, but other people think that this is not a very good idea.
